Dear Mr Macleod

With reference to Her Majesty's decision to appoint you a Member of the Order of the British Empire, Civil Division, I am writing to let you know that, if you wish, this Office can contribute towards your travelling and other expenses in attending the investiture ceremony to which you will in due course be summoned. The contribution will be assessed as follows:-

I. Personal Expenses

Second class rail fare (including sleeper if more convenient), boat or bus fare from your place of residence to the place of investiture, and return. Where absence from home overnight is necessary, a contribution of £45 (London) - £33.90 (elsewhere) - £16.95 (allowance for sleeper journeys) will be payable for each night, covering a period of 24 hours. For absences not overnight, including any period additional to 24 hour periods covered by overnight absences, the contribution will be £2.65 for a period of at least 5 hours but not more than 10 hours, and for £5.85 for a period exceeding 10 hours. (Normally subsistence is payable for not more than 2 nights absence from home.)

II. Expenses of Relatives or Friends

Second class rail fare (including sleeper if more convenient), boat or bus fare from the place of residence within the UK to the place of investiture, and return for not more than 2 relatives or friends for whom passes to attend the investiture have been issued by the Central Chancery. No subsistence allowance is payable for relatives or friends.

III. Taxi Fares

The cost of taxi fares for yourself and the 2 relatives or friends accompanying you may also be reimbursed for the return journeys between a London railway station and Buckingham Palace or, if staying overnight, the return journey

INVESTITURE D

30th January 1967

Sir,

I am commanded to inform you that an investiture will be held at Buckingham Palace on Thursday, 30th March, 1967, at which your attendance is requested.

I am desired to say that you should arrive at the Palace between the hours of 10 o'clock and 10.30 a.m. and the latter should be shown on entering the gates of the Palace, and at the Grand Hall Entrance of the Palace, an order card of admission issued to recipients. Cars may be parked in the outer Quadrangle of the Palace under police direction. A Car Parking Label is enclosed herewith.

You are permitted to bring with you TWO guests exclusive of friends to watch the Ceremony. This number may be increased to THREE only if your guests are your spouse and two children (of your own) in NO circumstances can this number be increased. Tickets for them may be obtained by making application on the form enclosed herewith which should be returned to me as soon as possible.

DRESS

(a) Serving Officers and Other Ranks of the Royal Navy, Royal Marines, Army, Royal Air Force and Members of the Police Force and Fire Brigades should wear the dress laid down in the regulations of their respective Service. Decorations and Medals should not be worn nor should medals be worn.

(b) Retired Officers who are not in possession of the dress described in (a) should wear Morning Dress or Dark Lounge Suit. Orders, Decorations and Medals should not be worn.

(c) Civilians may, if they so desire, wear the uniform of the Civil Organisation or Service in which they belong; otherwise they should wear Morning Dress or Dark Lounge Suit. Orders, Decorations and Medals should not be worn.

(a) Outside, in the inner Quadrangle, a limited number of Press photographers and film cameramen are issued with passes by the Press Secretary to The Queen, and are allowed to photograph and film as recipients and their guests leave the Grand Entrance after their Investiture.

(b) There are also photographers present from a commercial firm should you wish to have a colour souvenir photograph taken, for which a charge is made by the firm concerned.

(c) There is no objection to family cameras being used in the Quadrangle but cameras may not be taken inside the Palace.

(d) If, however, you wish to make your own private arrangements to be photographed, you should arrange for this to be done outside the Palace forecourt gates, as it is not possible to admit personal photographers.

Investitures usually finish between 12 and 12.30 p.m.

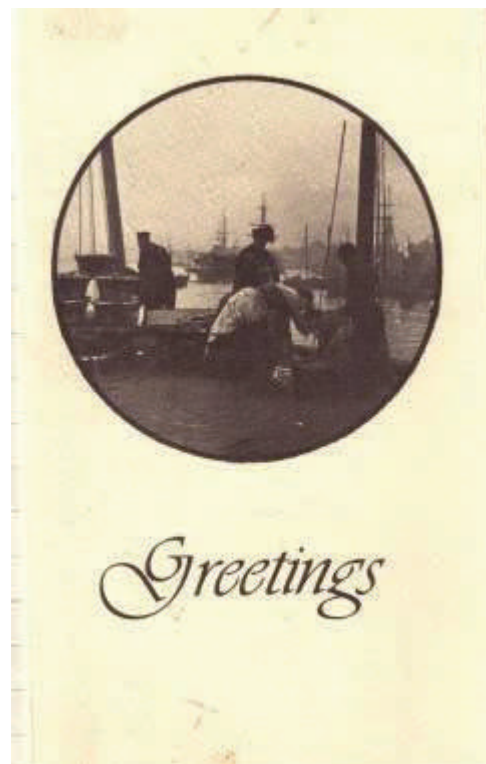

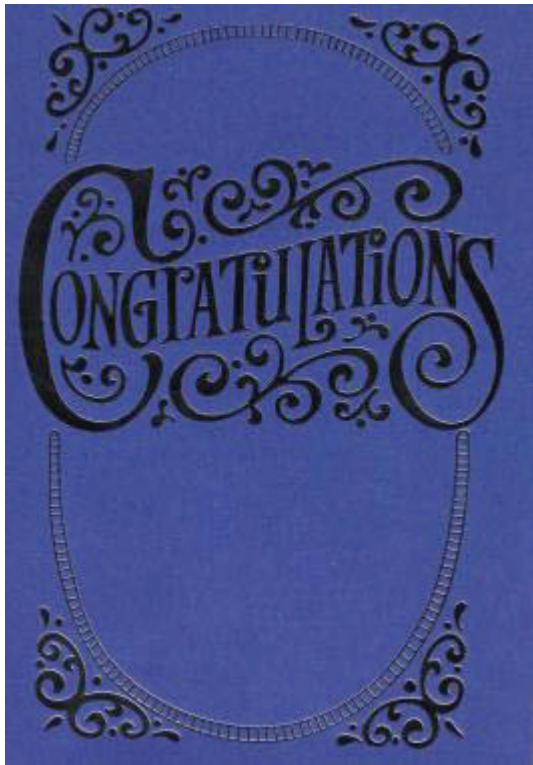
