



## [Place-names - Rubha Iosal]

### Ref. 158 Rudha Iosal

The common grazing area south-east of Camus Chalaboist. A prominent headland.

### Ref. 159 Meall an Eoin (The Hill of the Birds)

Meall-an-Eoin is a fairly high hill to the south-east of Croft 10. The village boundary wall passes along the top of the hill apportioning it as partly within the village and partly on the common grazing.

### Ref. 160 A Leathad Chloich (The Stoney Hill)

After passing through the south gate of Croft 10 the footpath 'Frith-raid' passes through this stony hill before one comes to 'Loch-na-Craoibhe'. This path was frequently used by the people going back and fore to their peat-banks.

### Ref. 161 Loch na Craoibh (The Loch of the Tree)

This is the only fresh-water loch in the area of the 'Rudha-Iosal'. There were no brown trout on it until someone put a few on it in the second half of the 20<sup>th</sup> century.

### Ref. 162 Sithean Loch na Craoibh

This is the small hill near 'Loch-na-Craoibhe' in the 'Rudha-Iosal'.

### Ref. 163 Allt Loch na Craoibh

This is the small stream flowing out of Loch-na-Craoibhe.

### Ref. 164 Gleann a Chreagan Ruaidh

This is the glen that extends from the village boundary wall pertaining to Crofts 10 and 11 Calbost right through to the Creagan Ruadh on the shores of Loch Odhairn or (Loch Grabhair).

### Ref. 165 Sithean Creag Dhonnachaidh

This is the high hill above the shore-line at 'STACAC-AN-FHIR-MHAOL' and 'CREAG DHONNACHADH' from which it gets its name.

### Ref. 166 An Allt Dubh

This is the stream that rises in the 'Rudha-Iosal' and flows into the Loch-Dubh in the middle of Calbost.

### Ref. 167 An Corran Ulbaidh

This is a prominent hill on the coast line half way between Loch Odhairn and Camus Chalabost.

### Ref. 168 Uamha na Gleadhraith (a cave)

This cave is about half way along Gleann a Creagan Ruaidh, in the area of the 'CHAIRNEACH' which is a sloping hill of rocks and boulders (see Ref. 169).

### Ref. 169 A Chàmach Bheag (a place of boulders)

Walking southwards from the village boundary wall of Crofts 10 and 11 towards 'MOL-AN-EICH', along Gleann a Creagan Ruaidh, one passes the 'CHAIRNEACH' on the right hand (west). It is a collection of boulders on a sloping hill.
